

CAREER RESEARCHING GUIDE

1. Take a variety of career assessments to identify careers that match your interests, values, aptitudes and personality preferences. **Our staff recommends beginning with the comprehensive career assessment, FOCUS 2**, which can be accessed from the OTC website (<http://www.otc.edu/17353.php>). OTC's Counseling Services department offers career counseling services free-of-charge for members of the OTC community. Career counseling can include the following: 1) career assessment; 2) thorough review of assessment results; 3) discussion of career researching techniques; and, 4) exploration of effective career decision-making methods. All of our services are provided in a private setting by our staff of counseling professionals. 2. Develop a list of careers that you would like to learn more about. If you have taken OTC's FOCUS 2, there will be numerous careers that have been identified for you based on your personal test results. FOCUS 2 will give you the opportunity to electronically save these careers for further exploration. If you take additional career assessments, write down **every** career about which you would like to learn more and add these careers to the ones you have saved inside FOCUS 2.
