



STEP 5: ARRANGE TO TAKE THE PLACEMENT TEST.

A placement exam is required if you have not taken the ACT in the past two years. If you are a transfer student and have not taken math and/or English in college, you must also complete a placement exam. Placement tests are free and no appointment is necessary. STEP 7: SCHEDULE A STAR SESSION.



TRANSFER DEGREES:

A.A. DEGREE (ASSOCIATE OF ARTS)

The Associate of Arts is a degree intended for students who want to transfer to a university or college to complete a bachelor's degree.

A.A.B. DEGREE (ASSOCIATE OF ARTS IN BUSINESS)

The Associate of Arts in Business is a degree for students who want to transfer to a university or college to pursue a major with a business or accounting focus.

A.A.B.H.S. DEGREE (ASSOCIATE OF ARTS IN BEHAVIORAL SCIENCE)

The Associate of Arts in Behavioral Science is a degree for students who want to transfer to pursue a major in psychology, criminology, sociology or social work.

A.A.T. DEGREE (ASSOCIATE OF ARTS IN TEACHING)

The Associate of Arts in Teaching prepares students for transfer to a four-year institution offering teacher education programs and certification for levels P-12.















A.A.S. DEGREE (ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE) IN BUSINESS

The Associate of Applied Science in Business is a degree designed to help you develop the necessary technical skills to pursue a career after two years of education. Choose one of our business programs below to start your path to success. *One-year certificate available.

- Accounting*
 Prepares students for careers in accounting, business and economics.

A.S.N. DEGREE (ASSOCIATE OF SCIENCE IN NURSING)

The Associate of Science in Nursing is designed for qualified Licensed Practical Nurses to complete the training required to apply to become a Registered Nurse in 36 weeks. Graduates may go to work in hospitals, in inpatient and outpatient departments, physician offices, nursing care facilities, home health care services, government agencies and outpatient care centers.



A.A.S. DEGREE (ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE) IN ALLIED HEALTH

The Associate of Applied Science is a degree designed to help you develop the necessary technical skills to pursue a career after two years of education. • Dental Assisting*

Trains students in oral health care to successfully assist dentists in a professional practice. This program is available in both a traditional seated track and also a hybrid track with both online and seated classes.

• Dental Hygiene

Training in all aspects of dental hygiene practice including cleaning, x-rays and much more.

EMT — Paramedic*

Teaches assessment and treatment of patients with medical emergencies.

Health Information Technology*

Teaches collection, analysis and security laws and procedures for health information and medical records.

• Hearing Instrument Science

Trains students to conduct hearing tests and properly fit hearing instruments.

Medical Lab Technician

Prepares students to perform a variety of medical laboratory tests on blood, urine and other bodily fluids that assist physicians in making decisions.

Nursing — Practical*

Learn various aspects of patient care for careers in long-term skilled care, home health care, doctors' offices, hospice, hospitals and industrial nursing.

Occupational Therapy Assistant

Trains students to treat patients who are relearning everyday activities after an illness or injury.

• Physical Therapist Assistant

Prepares students to monitor and assist with patients' physical therapy and communicate with patients and their families.

Respiratory Therapy

Trains students in mechanical ventilation, pharmacology and pulmonary disease diagnosis.

Trains students in repair, refinishing and collision damage estimation.

Automotive Technology*

Trains students in the fundamentals of automotive systems and repair.

• Computer Information Sciences*

Trains students in programming and website development.

• Construction Technology*

Trains students for careers in construction management and equipment operation.

Culinary Arts

Prepares students for careers in food preparation, purchasing, safety and management.

• Electrical* (certificate only)

Trains students in wiring and circuitry, safety, power generation and blueprint reading.

• Electronic Media Production

Trains students in video, audio, photography, game design and animation production.

• Fire Science Technology*

Prepares students for careers including firefighter, fire inspector and fire investigator.

Graphic Design Technology

Trains students in digital illustration, image editing, publishing and web design.

Heating, Refrigeration and A/C*

Trains students in maintenance and installation of heating, ventilation and air conditioning systems.

• Hospitality Management

Trains students in the fundamentals of management with regard to supervision of employees, revenue management, marketing and customer relations.

Industrial Maintenance Technology*

Prepares students for careers in industrial control and automation with skills in the installation, operation and maintenance of robots and other automated systems related to manufacturing and industrial processes.

Machine Tool Technology*

Trains students in the processes of manufacturing and machining with an understanding of specifications and methods of assembly to manufacture a product.

Cross-disciplinary program allows students to create customized degree by taking courses from our manufacturing related degree programs.

Training in computer, network and server operations and repair.

Paying for College

When it comes to the cost of courses, OTC employs a pricing structure referred to as tiered tuition. Generally, classes that cost more to teach are priced at a higher rate. **Tier I** courses are general education classes such as English and math, **Tier II** classes are technical education courses such as culinary and welding, and **Tier III** classes are allied health courses such as nursing and dental.

WHY SHOULD I CHOOSE OTC?

If you are looking at colleges, you know that there are a lot of great choices. Well, consider the cost. The cost of your freshman and sophomore years will cost, on average, \$36,000 at a private university and \$14,000 at a public university compared to \$5,000 at OTC. At OTC, you can get a great education with great flexibility at a great price.

HOW AM I GOING TO PAY FOR COLLEGE?

We have many options to assist you in paying for your education at OTC. Whether you are completing a GED, re-entering college, or graduating high school, there are scholarships you can apply for and financial aid available at OTC. Visit www.otc.edu/financialaid for more details.

WHAT IS FINANCIAL AID?

Financial aid is money dispersed to assist college students—it comes in all shapes and sizes. There are four major types of aid available to OTC students who qualify. Grants are awards that do not have to be repaid. Loans are borrowed money that must be repaid, often with interest. Student employment typically refers to the Federal Work Study Program. Scholarships are awarded to students based on various criteria and may be offered by institutions or outside sources. Learn more about OTC's available scholarships on pages 14-15.

HOW DO I RECEIVE FINANCIAL AID?

One of the most important steps for students who want to receive financial aid is to fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). In order to be considered for financial aid, students must apply for funds each year they plan to attend OTC. See details and upcoming deadlines on page 12.

HOW DOES THE A+ PROGRAM WORK?

The A+ Program provides tuition and student fees for qualified students who have graduated from Missouri high schools which have been designated as A+ schools. To qualify, students must meet the requirements established for the program including minimum grade point average (GPA), attendance, tutoring and good citizenship standards. DOES OTC HONOR VETERANS' BENEFITS?

OTC is approved for certification of students eligible to receive educational assistance from the Department of Veterans' Affairs. Students eligible to receive veterans' benefits must be enrolled in a program leading to an approved certificate or degree. WHAT ARE MY TUITION PAYMENT OPTIONS?

There are two payment options students can choose from. You may pay in full by your payment deadline through QuikPay using a credit card or echeck. If you are not paying all tuition and fees in full by the final fee payment deadline, you must enroll with My Payment Plan. MyPay-Monthly allows scheduled monthly payments. If you are anticipating financial aid, you may be eligible to enroll in My Pay-Delayed to defer your payment for the semester. For more information, visit www.otc.edu/financialservices.







Almost all of OTC's academic programs are available at the OTC Springfield Campus. See pages 6-11 for a full list of degrees/programs.


