



- **Dental Assisting***
Trains students in oral health care to successfully assist dentists in a professional practice. This program is available in both a traditional seated track and also a hybrid track with both online and seated classes.
- **Dental Hygiene**
Training in all aspects of dental hygiene practice including cleaning, x-rays and much more.
- **EMT — Paramedic***
Teaches assessment and treatment of patients with medical emergencies.
- **Health Information Technology***
Teaches collection, analysis and security laws and procedures for health information and medical records.
- **Hearing Instrument Science**
Trains students to conduct hearing tests and properly fit hearing instruments.
- **Medical Lab Technician**
Prepares students to perform a variety of medical laboratory tests on blood, urine and other bodily fluids that assist physicians in making decisions.



Prepares students for careers in animal industries, plant and soil science.

Trains students for careers in the land care industry, including landscaping.

Trains students in repair, refinishing and collision damage estimation.

- **Automotive Technology***
Trains students in the fundamentals of automotive systems and repair.

Paying for College

When it comes to the cost of courses, OTC employs a pricing structure referred to as tiered tuition. Generally, classes that cost more to teach are priced at a higher rate. **Tier I** courses are general education classes such as English and math, **Tier II** classes are technical education courses such as culinary and welding, and **Tier III** classes are allied health courses such as nursing and dental.

WHY SHOULD I CHOOSE OTC?

If you are looking at colleges, you know that there are a lot of great choices. Well, consider the cost. Your freshman and sophomore years will cost, on average, \$39,000 at a private university and \$15,000 at a public university compared to \$6,000 at OTC. At OTC, you can get a great education with great flexibility at a great price.

HOW AM I GOING TO PAY FOR COLLEGE?

We have many options to assist you in paying for your education at OTC. Whether you are completing a HSE, re-entering college, or graduating high school, there are scholarships you can apply for and financial aid available at OTC. Visit otc.edu/financialaid for more details.

WHAT IS FINANCIAL AID?

Financial aid is money dispersed to assist college students — it comes in all shapes and sizes. There are four major types of aid available to OTC students who qualify. Grants are awards that do not have to be repaid. Loans are borrowed money that must be repaid, often with interest. Student employment typically refers to the Federal Work Study Program. Scholarships are awarded to students based on various criteria and may be offered by institutions or outside sources. Learn more about OTC's available scholarships on pages 14-15.

HOW DO I RECEIVE FINANCIAL AID?

One of the most important steps for students who want to receive financial aid is to fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). In order to be considered for financial aid, students must apply for funds each year they plan to attend OTC. See details and upcoming deadlines on page 12.

HOW DOES THE A+ PROGRAM WORK?

The A+ Program provides tuition and student fees for qualified students who have graduated from Missouri high schools, which have been designated as A+ schools. To qualify, students must meet the requirements established for the program including minimum grade point average (GPA), attendance, tutoring and good citizenship standards. To receive A+ funds, students must complete the FAFSA and have an A+-certified official high school transcript sent to OTC. Visit otc.edu/Aplus for more information.

DOES OTC HONOR VETERANS' BENEFITS?

OTC is approved for certification of students eligible to receive educational assistance from the Department of Veterans' Affairs. Students eligible to receive veterans' benefits must be enrolled in a program leading to an approved certificate or degree. For information regarding your eligibility to receive VA education benefits, contact the Veterans Affairs Administration at 1-888-442-4551 or visit va.gov. OTC Veterans Services information can be found online at otc.edu/veteran or by e-mailing gibill@otc.edu.

WHAT ARE MY TUITION PAYMENT OPTIONS?

There are two payment options students can choose from. You may pay in full by your payment deadline through QuikPay using a credit card or echeck. If you are not paying all tuition and fees in full by the final fee payment deadline, you must enroll with My Payment Plan. MyPay-Monthly allows scheduled monthly payments. If you are anticipating financial aid, you may be eligible to enroll in My Pay-Delayed to defer your payment for the semester. For more information, visit otc.edu/financialservices.
