What is a Title IX/E&C issue?

- Gender Based Discrimination
 - Bullying because of gender or protected class
 - Derogatory or sexist remarks
- Harassment
 - Stalking
 - Obscene phone calls, texts, emails or gestures
 - Sexual jokes, whistles, catcalls or innuendos
 - Bullying based on protected class
- Sexual Violence
 - Sexual assault or rape
 - Inappropriate touching
 - Aggressive sexual advances
- Pregnant and Parenting Students
 - who are pregnant or recently had a baby
 - who recently lost or terminated a pregnancy
 - who recently experienced a false pregnancy

Reporting a Concern

All employees have a duty to report sexual misconduct or discimination to the Title IX/Equity and Compliance Office when they receive a report or witness an instance. If a student reports an incident to you: listen, support and report.

Reports should include:

- The date and times of the alleged conduct
- Names of all people involved
- All details of what happened
- Contact information for the complainant

If the complaint is substantiated after an investigation, OTC will take appropriate action, which includes: probation, counseling services, no contact orders, classroom reassignment, training, suspension or expulsion.
